

MINUTES OF COUNCIL MEETING

June 7, 2021

A regular council meeting was duly called to order at 5:00 p.m. by Mayor Bob Roesler on Monday, June 7, 2021 with members Carlee Hunter, Kurt Olson, and Bob Roesler present. Absent, Matt Larson and Brad Ringnell. Also present City Admin/Police Chief Brad Hughes and Deputy Clerk Kym Christiansen.

Motion by Larson to approve the agenda, second by Ringnell, carried.

Motion by Ringnell to approve the minutes as written and sent to each council member for study, second by Hunter, carried.

Consent agenda including payment of bills was declared approved.

Motion by Ringnell to approve Resolution 2021-9 Accepting The Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery Fund Established Under The American Rescue Plan Act, second by Olson. Ringnell, yea; Olson, yea; Larson, yea; Hunter, yea; Roesler, yea. Resolution 2021-9 approved.

City Admin/Police Chief Hughes presented the determination letter regarding the Local Road Improvement Program application stating that the city was not awarded funds this year.

Hughes received a request from the Fox Lake Conversation Club regarding the wiliness to allow the grader and operator to maintain the gravel road leading to Everett Park. They are estimating that it will take 60 to 90 minutes to fix the issues they have with the road at this time. Discussion was held regarding the cost of the machine and operator was held. Motion by Olson to authorize the City Administrator to negotiate the use of grader and other items and report back at the next meeting, second by Larson, carried.

A thank you note from Martin County West Community Education was received for review.

Amy Long with Mayo Health System was present to information regarding the Mobile Service Unit that will be offered in the city. The mobile unit would replace the coverage lost by the closing of the Sherburn clinic. The until would be shared with the Mayo Clinic Southwest Region and Mayo Clinic Southeast Region. Long estimates that the mobile unit should be in Sherburn 4 times a month. Discussion regarding the service provided and a location to park the unit where discussed. Long stated that the unit may be available for open house during the Fire Relief Association chicken feed. The mobile unit may be ready for use by July 5.

Administrator Report

- The drilling of the new well has started but the pump has not been ordered so the back-up pump may be used until the new pump arrives.
- Curb painting started during the week of June 1 and will continue until the city is completed. The crosswalks are also being painted during the same time. The flower pots are in place and being watered in the mornings. The mowing and trimming are being taken of by the seasonal help. The cracks in the road and gutters will be sprayed to kill and prevent weeds from growing.
- The house on South Manyaska has been demolished.

Motion to adjourn by Olson, second by Larson, carried. Meeting declared adjourned at 5:38 p.m.
